A few reminders to all:

- 1. The parking areas along Redford Street and Thames Boulevard are Drop Off Zones ONLY, in the morning and as such the expectation is that students are dropped off and parents then drive off. 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Prayer:

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, a day on which Catholics traditionally resist eating between meals

We experienced thrilling experiments like when I added Alka-Seltzer to water and it exploded like a rocket to the roof because of the chemical reaction!

There were multiple other experiments that we did but the most fun was playing with the non-Newtonian fluid named Oobleck as it was slimy when no pressure is applied but when you apply the pressure it becomes very solid almost like a rock. After that towards the end of the lesson I saw something quite incredible. I saw a plasma ball that was able to light up a light bulb.

All in all it was a great experience and I would like to have another one like it sometime.

Safer Internet Day 2024 – Connect, Reflect, Protect

On Tuesday February 6 the students engaged in various discussions and learning activities to celebrate Safer Internet Day.

Safer Internet Day is a global initiative to raise awareness of online safety issues.

The eSafety Commissioner leads the initiative in Australia and we help educate our students about online safety risks, like online abuse, how to be safe online and where to go for help.



This Safer Internet Day encourages us all to take three simple actions when approaching online safety: **Connect. Reflect. Protect.**

Connect safely by keeping apps and devices secure and reviewing your privacy settings regularly.

Reflect on how your actions online may affect others or your safety.

Protect yourself and others by visiting eSafety.gov.au to find out how to stay safe online and report online abuse.

This year, Bethany Catholic Primary School has partnered with The Resilience Project (TRP) to support students to develop their mental health and wellbeing. Staff have recently engaged in professional development opportunities and are excited about integrating The Resilience Project into their daily practices in order to support all students in our community. In the coming weeks, The Resilience Project will be launched across Centres where students will develop daily practices centred around the four key concepts of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness and Emotional Literacy (GEM+EL). These lessons may include video snippets, GEM chats,



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writing in student journals or other fun activities. Students will be encouraged to share personal anecdotes and stories, identify self-care practices that work for them and build upon their emotional literacy so that they can label their emotions.

We have a new banner for our school that identifies our partnership with the Resilience Project, so keep an eye out for it!

Learning at Home (Homework)

On Tuesday 13th February we will begin **Learning at Home** (homework) across the school. The learning tasks provided will complement and reinforce classroom learning, whilst assisting students

to develop positive study habits and time management skills. The tasks will aim to support, consolidate or at times extend skills previously practised.

Learning tasks will be sent out every Tuesday and returned the following Monday for corrections and feedback from P-6. Overall, Learning at Home will consist of English and Mathematics tasks, and may also include tasks from other curriculum areas too.

The following time allocations per night are:

Exploration – 10 minutes

Bridging – 20 minutes

Discovery – 15 minutes

Leadership – 30 minutes

Matters Financial

Student Levies

All student levies (\$395.00 per student) are expected to be finalised by <u>Friday, 2nd February</u>. Payment can be made over the phone by credit card or in person between 8.30am – 4:00pm.

Health Care Card Holders (CSEF)

Parents who hold a Health Care Card that is current on 30th January, 2023 may be eligible for the CSEF. This grant offers \$125 per student. The payment is made directly to the school and as such would offset \$150.00 of the student fee.

Families with a Health Care Card are asked to make an application for the Sport / Excursion grant on either at the beginning of the school year. It is important that you have your Health Care Card with you when making an application. Successful applicants will then only need to pay \$245.00 per student fee.

If you received this payment in 2023 you <u>do not</u> need to reapply. You will automatically receive this payment if your Health Care Card is still valid.

Concessional Fee Policy

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage

You will also be required to complete a form as a part of the process to determine eligibility. Should you wish further information re this funding or if you have questions as to whether you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact the school and ask to speak to Joanne Webster.

First Instalment School Fee

If you opted to by your school fees by three instalments, the first instalment \$590.00 was due by Friday 9th February.
