Dear Families,

As we enter the last few weeks of term, we have much to be grateful for and much to look forward to. With our swimming program completed, we thank you the families for your preparation and organisation of your children. When going down to the pool to watch the students, the experience of swimming lessons (albeit short) provides the students with water familiarisation skills and some lessons. A big thank you to Carin, Deputy Principal for her significant organisation of this. An enormous feat organising and co-ordinating 574 students, buses and the swimming school. Well done!

We have our Athletics Carnival in Term 2 week 1, Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> April. Please mark this date in your diaries. A note will come home on Friday advising of this.

School Photo Day is also on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> April. Students will be required to dress in full school uniform. More information to come.

Correct school uniform is an expectation at Bethany. A reminder to all families the sports uniform is the ONLY uniform whereby students can wear runners. Full school uniform states students must wear black school shoes or black boots. In the newsletter dated 13<sup>th</sup> December 2023 we reminded all families about the expectations for school shoes in 2024...

***A reminder to all families, as you prepare to buy shoes for your child for the new school year, of the School Uniform requirements with shoes. Black school shoes not runners are to be worn with the full school uniform. Runners are only to be worn with sports uniform. Please understand this will be compulsory in the new school year. 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## Positive Behaviour for Learning PBL

'Tis the sea-sun for swimming and Bridging Centre was next on the blocks. It wasn't just their swimming skills being put to the test. Students were given the chance to give their PBL skills of being safe, respectful and responsible a real workout. The rotation of hubs heading to the pools had to go swimmingly and it did!

Students went to great depths to be respectful to their instructors, be responsible and organised with their property and time, as well as floating about safely. After a couple of days, they really got into the swim of things. *When asked how they think PBL helped them succeed during swimming, this is what they had to say:*

## The Resilience Project

It is with great excitement that students and teachers enter on a Monday morning ready to begin our TRP 'Monday Mojo' sessions.

During weeks 6 & 7, we will be exploring the second TRP concept of 'empathy' with our students. We begin by building a shared understanding that empathy is 'the ability to put ourselves in another person's shoes', therefore understanding the joys and challenges experienced by those around us.

*Working on empathy helps us to identify, understand and feel what another person is feeling. When we show empathy or we do something kind for someone else our brain releases oxytocin. This leads to increasing our self-esteem/confidence, energy levels, positivity and overall happiness.*

### Family Habit Builder:

Every night at dinner, have each person thank another family member for something they've done or said today, or give another family member a compliment.

### Whole Family Activity: Neighbourhood Kindness Challenge

As a family, choose an act of kindness from the list below that you would like to do for a neighbour or family friend. Each family member can select one to commit to, or you can choose to do one together.

- Cook them something delicious like a cake, hot bread, or cookies.
- Write a note to put in their letterbox thanking them for being a great neighbour or friend.
- Design them a Thank You card.
- Pick or buy some flowers to deliver to them.
- Choose a little plant from your garden to give them.

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- Make them a gift from things around your house.
- Offer to do a job for them, like wash their car or water their garden.
- Offer to take their pets for a walk.
- Invite them over for afternoon tea.
- Invite them on a walk.
- Recommend one of your favourite books to borrow and read.
- Ask them if they need anything from the shops next time you buy groceries.
- Say hello next time you see them, and ask them how their day is going.

Feel free to do more than one and spread the kindness even further!

## Matters Financial

### Health Care Card Holders (CSEF)

Parents who hold a Health Care Card that is current on 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2023 may be eligible for the CSEF. This grant offers \$125 per student. The payment is made directly to the school and as such would offset \$150.00 of the student fee.

Families with a Health Care Card are asked to make an application for the Sport / Excursion grant on either at the beginning of the school year. It is important that you have your Health Care Card with you when making an application. Successful applicants will then only need to pay \$245.00 per student fee.

**If you received this payment in 2023 you do not need to reapply. You will automatically receive this payment if your Health Care Card is still valid.**

### Concessional Fee Policy

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage

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You will also be required to complete a form as a part of the process to determine eligibility. Should you wish further information re this funding or if you have questions as to whether you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact the school and ask to speak to Joanne Webster.

### **First Instalment School Fee**

If you opted to by your school fees by three instalments, the first instalment **\$590.00** was due by **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February**.
