### Uniform:

Students are always encouraged to wear their uniform with pride. Summer uniform will be expected for all of term one.

- Full uniform is to be worn at all times. This includes correct footwear. Runners are **not acceptable** other than with sports uniform.
- The Bethany hat is a legionnaire style. It is an expectation that students have their hat at school **every** day. **Please ensure your child's hat is clearly named.**
- The Bethany school bag can also be purchased from Rushfords.
- All students are required to have a rain jacket in their bag every day
- Hair is to be neatly groomed, appropriate to the wearing of a uniform, fastened back, and off the face at all times. This expectation is for both boys and girls.
- Hair accessories are to be kept to the school colours – royal blue / gold.
- Unusual fashion modes that are not in keeping with the wearing of a school uniform are unacceptable. – i.e. unnatural hair colour.
- Fashion jewellery or accessories of any kind are not to be worn. One wrist watch, and a pair of **plain** studs or small plain sleepers (gold or silver), one in each **lower** lobe of the ear is permissible.

### Learning at Home (Homework)

On Tuesday 11th February we will begin **Learning at Home** (homework) across the school. The learning tasks provided will complement and reinforce classroom learning, whilst assisting students to develop positive study habits and time management skills. The tasks will aim to support, consolidate or at times extend skills previously practised. Learning tasks will be sent out every Tuesday and returned the following Monday for corrections and feedback from P-6. Overall, Learning at Home will consist of English and Mathematics tasks, and may also include tasks from other curriculum areas too.

The following time allocations per night are:

Exploration - 10 minutes

Discovery - 15 minutes

Bridging - 20 minutes

Leadership - 30 minutes



## Positive Behaviour for Learning

At Bethany, we are committed to fostering a safe, respectful, and responsible learning environment for all students. To ensure a positive start to the school year, we will be resetting and reinforcing our expectations for Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL).

In the first few weeks of term, teachers will work closely with students to revisit our school's core values and behaviour expectations. Through classroom discussions, role-playing activities, and visual reminders, students will gain a clear understanding of what it means to be respectful, responsible, and safe in all areas of the school. This also includes revisiting our PBL matrix and flow chart (see below) for those requiring explicit reteaching of specific behaviours.

We will also acknowledge and celebrate positive behaviours through our reward systems, ensuring students feel valued for their efforts. By working together as a community, we can help every child thrive socially and academically.

## The Resilience Project 2025

At Bethany, we are excited to continue The Resilience Project into its second year, supporting our students' mental health and wellbeing. In 2025, there will be some exciting changes to how the program is delivered, ensuring it remains engaging and relevant for our students.

Students will use an updated Student Journal, featuring fresh activities to help them reflect on gratitude, empathy, and mindfulness (GEM). Approximately 80% of the lessons will feature new content, providing a refreshed learning experience while continuing to promote positive mental health practices. There will also be a change in presenter, transitioning from Hugh van Cuylenburg to Marty Heppell. Marty brings his own unique energy and approach to inspire our students.

We are also excited to launch The Resilience Project's Parent Portal to the Bethany community in 2025. This resource will empower families to connect with the program, enabling parents and carers to reinforce the lessons learned at school and foster positive mental health practices at home. Stay tuned regarding how you can access this Parent Portal from home.

We are thrilled to see the continued growth of The Resilience Project at our school and look



forward to seeing the positive impact it will have on our students in 2025.

## Child Safe Standards

Last year, Bethany Catholic Primary School showcased its commitment to meeting the *Child Safe Standards* through regular updates in our newsletters. Each edition highlighted the steps we take to ensure a safe, inclusive, and nurturing environment for every child. From outlining policies and procedures to promoting student voice and celebrating diversity, we shared how our community upholds these standards. By embedding these practices into daily school life, we continue to prioritize the safety and wellbeing of all students. This year we have attached a summary of these standards. Thank you for partnering with us in building a school culture where every child feels valued and protected.

The poster is titled "Victoria's Child Safe Standards" and "Plain language summary". It features 11 numbered boxes, each with an icon and a brief description of a standard. The standards are: 1. Welcomes Aboriginal children; 2. Child safety is important at all levels; 3. Supports children to know their rights; 4. Tells families about safety; 5. Understands child differences; 6. Staff know what to do; 7. Children know how to make complaints; 8. Trains staff to keep children safe; 9. Makes children safe online; 10. Checks and improves safety ways; 11. Has written policies. A footer box provides contact information for the Commission for Children and Young People.

**1** Your organisation welcomes Aboriginal children. You support them to express their culture and to enjoy their rights. You don't allow racism.

**2** Child safety is important to everyone at all levels in your organisation. You document how you find, avoid, and stop risks of child abuse or harm.

**3** Your organisation supports children to know their rights to be safe from abuse, informed, and involved. You help them to talk openly and take part in decisions that affect them.

**4** Your organisation tells families and the community about what you do, and how you keep children safe from harm and abuse. You help families to have a say and to take part in decisions that affect their child.

**5** Your organisation understands that every child is different and has different needs. You make sure that they can get the information and help that they need.

**6** Staff know what they must do to keep children safe from abuse and harm. They record, report, and share information about child safety when they should. Staff who work with children have had the background checks they need.

**7** Children and their families know how to make a complaint and what happens when a complaint is made. Your staff know how to respond properly to complaints.

**8** Your organisation trains and supports staff to keep children safe from abuse and harm. Your staff know the signs of child abuse and harm and what to do if there are issues of abuse and harm.

**9** Your organisation makes sure children are safe when they use your services, settings, and activities. This includes when children are online.

**10** Your organisation checks and improves the ways you keep children safe from abuse and harm.

**11** Your organisation has written policies about how you keep children safe from abuse and harm. They are easy to understand, and all staff follow them.

### Key Enrolment Dates for Year 5 2025 beginning Secondary School in 2027

If you wish to enrol your child in a Catholic Secondary School beginning in 2027, please observe the following dates.

- Tuesday 28 January 2025 – Applications will open for students commencing Year 7 in 2027.
- Friday 15 August 2025 – Applications will close.
- Friday 17 October 2025 – Offers will be posted to prospective 2027 Year 7 applicants.
- Friday 7 November 2025 – Final date for parents/carers to accept an offer made by a school.

## Matters Financial

### Student Levies

All student levies (\$420.00 per student) are expected to be finalised by **Friday 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2025**. Payment can be made over the phone by credit card or in person between 8:30am – 4:00pm.

### Health Care Card Holders (CSEF)

Parents who hold a Health Care Card that is current on 29<sup>th</sup> January, 2025 may be eligible for the CSEF. This grant offers \$150.00 per student. The payment is made directly to the school and as such would offset \$150.00 of the student fee.

Families with a Health Care Card are asked to make an application for the Sport / Excursion grant at the beginning of the school year. It is important that you have your Health Care Card with you when making an application. Successful applicants will then only need to pay \$270.00 per student fee.

**If you received this payment in 2024 you do not need to reapply. You will automatically receive this payment if your Health Care Card is still valid.**

### Concessional Fee Policy

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage

You will also be required to complete a form as a part of the process to determine eligibility. Should you wish further information re this funding or if you have questions as to whether you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact the school and ask to speak to Joanne Webster.

## First Instalment School Fee

If you opted to pay your school fees by three instalments, the first instalment **\$615.00** is due by **Friday 14<sup>th</sup> February**.
