# Exploration Centre News- Preps - Term 1, 2024 What a great start!



# Reminders:

# <u>School Start Time</u>

The school gates open at 8:30am and a reminder to families that no student is to arrive prior to this time. The welcome bell will ring at 8.45am. The learning day begins at 8:50am, therefore students entering the school after 8:50am will be required to get a late pass from the office. The school day ends at 3:00pm, and it is most important that students are collected at this time each day.

## <u>School Uniform</u>

Please ensure that your child has <u>two school hats.</u> One that will be used and left at school during the day and one that will stay in their bag and can be worn going to and from school, at after school care or as a spare hat when required. As part of our sunsmart policy at Bethany all students are required to wear a hat during break times - NO HAT, NO PLAY!

Please ensure that all clothing items (e.g school jumpers, school zip up jackets, etc) are clearly labelled with both the students first name and surname.

### Brain Food Break

Each day at 10:00am, the students will be having a short brain break. During this time the students will be eating a small, healthy snack of fruit or vegetables. This will be of a 5-10 min duration so please ensure that you only place a small amount of food into a **separate container or ziplock bag** that your child will be able to finish during this time (eg 3-4 strawberries, a few slices of apple or carrots).

## • Drink Bottles

As we can experience some hot weather during the summer months of Term 1, it is essential that all students have a **clearly named drink bottle** with them each day. Please ensure that the drink bottle contains water.

## Learning at Home (Homework)

Our Learning at Home program began this week with all students bringing a black zip pouch with a Learning at Home workbook inside. Each week students will be given a variety of tasks to complete at home. These will include learning experiences centred around Literacy and Mathematics. Each Tuesday the students will bring home their homework in a large blue zip pouch and will have the week to complete their tasks, returning their homework the following Monday to their hub teacher. For students in the Exploration Centre, the time allocation is 10 minutes per night.

## <u>Resource Centre</u>

Bethany's Resource Centre (Library) is a learning space where the students are able to borrow books to read at home. Each hub will have an allocated day that they will attend the centre. Please send along the **Blue Bethany Showbag**, that was given to all students on their orientation day, to use as a library bag for the children to place their borrowed book inside.



All students **<u>MUST have a library bag</u>** with them on the day in order to borrow. This will ensure all books are protected, as well as making it easier to transport

them to and from school. Please label this bag with your child's name and hub. Library books may be borrowed for a duration of 2 weeks.

which can often lead to small accidents.

Throughout the Exploration Centre all teachers will have high expectations of students and the way they behave by **being Safe**, **Respectful and Responsible**. Teachers will continue to teach, reinforce and acknowledge the expected PBL behaviours.

## Term 1 Learning and Teaching in the Exploration Centre...

In **Religious Education**, students will focus on learning about Jesus and who he is, along with building their knowledge of Holy Week as we approach Easter later in the term.

Students will be able to explain why the stories about Jesus' life, death and resurrection are important for us, and will make connections between their lived experiences of family and friends with these stories. Students will also participate in a variety of prayer rituals and interpret why we pray as people of faith.

English Throughout the term, the students will be establishing many routines and expectations that will set them up for success when working during their English lessons. They will be learning to: • work in small groups (independent of teacher) • unpack and repack resources and games • take turns and use quiet voices when working. #### Inquiry:

## Our key Inquiry Concept this term is "Community - Where Do I Belong?"

Over the course of the term students will:

- explore who is in their family and what community groups they belong to (School, Church, clubs, etc)
- learn the importance of rules within the school community and how to make good choices that keep them safe
- investigate the people in their wider community (Firemen, Policemen, etc).

#### <u>PE</u>

#### Veronica Spencer

This term for PE, there will be a focus on fair play and teamwork. This will be achieved by teaching students how to support each other in positive ways when playing games or sport. They will have the opportunity to develop their fundamental motor skills by using a variety of equipment and objects. Students will be learning the correct techniques of running, jumping and throwing.



#### Parlo Italiano (I speak Italian) with Claudia Pesolilla Buongiorno!

The teaching of the Italian language at Bethany continues for the third consecutive year. Our native speaker Italian Learning Assistant, Claudia Pesolilla, will support and facilitate the teaching of Italian throughout the school. Each week students will learn and consolidate daily, a set of 5 Italian focus words accompanied by gestures. Over time, the students will build on known words to create Italian phrases. Students are encouraged to practise the language daily and to speak to each other in Italian as often as possible throughout the day. Italian videos, flashcards, games and songs will be used daily to reinforce the Italian language.



# **Specialist Subjects**

At Bethany students rotate throughout all our Specialist Subjects across the year. Each cycle runs for 13 weeks and will often cross over Terms. All students will have the opportunity to experience the different Specialist areas as the year progresses.

#### <u>PE</u> Veronica Spencer

Students from Star and Earth hubs will be learning about teamwork with a focus on how to be a team player, winning and losing, respecting their peers, fair play and following instructions and decisions. In these lessons, students will learn and participate in games and activities that they can play at recess and lunch with their peers.



#### <u>Robotics</u> (Digital Technologies) Ash Hudson

Students in Earth and Star hubs will begin their Digital Technology journey using the programmable Bee-Bot robots. They will be introduced to concepts

such as directional language and computation thinking (thinking like a computer) through guided play activities. The weekly lessons will also provide an excellent opportunity for students to practise important interpersonal skills when working alongside their peers.



### <u>Music</u> Trish Hollenbach

Students in Sky and Ocean hubs will be singing a range of simple songs with actions. They will also be listening to a wide range of music and musical story books, as these will lay the foundation for music literacy. Students are learning that music has loud and soft sounds (dynamics), high and low sounds

(pitch) and fast and slow sounds (tempo). They will be using a range of percussion instruments including claves (rhythm sticks) to play along to the beat of the music as well as simple rhythms.



#### <u>Science</u> Natasha D'Cunha

In Science, students from Ocean and Sky hubs will begin exploring and observing the different materials in our everyday world and how their properties can change. Students will record their

observations of how the different materials differ and are similar in their appearance and how this impacts how they can be used.
