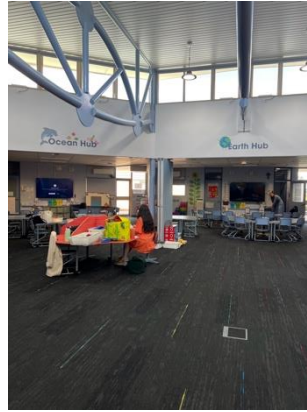
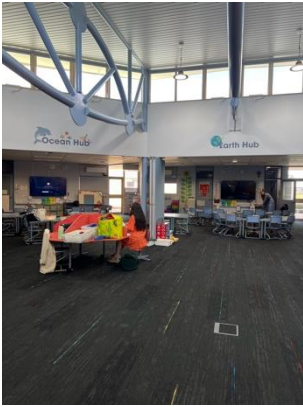
I hope that you all have enjoyed the holiday break, having had the opportunity to rest and relax, and enjoy the extra family time.

Over the last three days the staff at Bethany have had the opportunity to take part in professional learning to continue to build their capacity in learning and teaching, wellbeing and faith. On the first two days the teachers engaged in professional learning in the Science of Reading with Greg Clements, the focus this year is on Writing (last year was Reading). We also spent time on Day 3, revisiting the Positive Behaviours for Learning Framework, and routines associated with this, to provide a learning environment whereby students understand what it is to Be Safe, Be Responsible and Be Respectful. Jane Bennett an expert in this area led this with Carin our Deputy Principal in Wellbeing, Diversity and Engagement. Staff also spent time completing compliance, revisiting school priorities through our Annual Action Plan for 2024, and preparing for the return of our students. A very productive three days!!



During the school holidays, we continued to have painting done in the Exploration Centre. We also had new signage installed around the school, labelling learning spaces and our Positive Behaviours for Learning- Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be Responsible, is situated around the school.

All students attending Bethany Primary School have the right to feel safe. The care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people is a fundamental responsibility of all within our school.



Our strong belief as a school is to have open communication lines between families and staff in an endeavour to partner with our families in the child's learning. Uniform:

Students are always encouraged to wear their uniform with pride. Summer uniform will be expected for all of term one.

- Full uniform is to be worn at all times. This includes correct footwear. Runners are **not acceptable** other than with sports uniform.
- The Bethany hat is a legionnaire style. It is an expectation that students have their hat at school **every** day. **Please ensure your child's hat is clearly named.**
- The Bethany school bag can also be purchased from Rushfords.
- All students are required to have a rain jacket in their bag every day
- Hair is to be neatly groomed, appropriate to the wearing of a uniform, fastened back, and off the face at all times. This expectation is for both boys and girls.
- Hair accessories are to be kept to the school colours – royal blue / gold.
- Unusual fashion modes that are not in keeping with the wearing of a school uniform are unacceptable. – i.e. unnatural hair colour.
- Fashion jewellery or accessories of any kind are not to be worn. One wrist watch, and a pair of **plain** studs or small plain sleepers (gold or silver), one in each **lower** lobe of the ear is permissible.
- No makeup or nail polish is to be worn.

Learning at Home (Homework)

On Tuesday 13th February we will begin **Learning at Home** (homework) across the school. The learning tasks provided will complement and reinforce classroom learning, whilst assisting students to develop positive study habits and time management skills. The tasks will aim to support, consolidate or at times extend skills previously practised.

Learning tasks will be sent out every Tuesday and returned the following Monday for corrections and feedback from P-6. Overall, Learning at Home will consist of English and Mathematics tasks, and may also include tasks from other curriculum areas too.

Leadership - 30 minutes

Matters Financial

Student Levies

All student levies (\$395.00 per student) are expected to be finalised by **Friday, 2nd February**. Payment can be made over the phone by credit card or in person between 8.30am – 4:00pm.

Health Care Card Holders (CSEF)

Parents who hold a Health Care Card that is current on 30th January, 2023 may be eligible for the CSEF. This grant offers \$125 per student. The payment is made directly to the school and as such would offset \$150.00 of the student fee.

Families with a Health Care Card are asked to make an application for the Sport / Excursion grant on either at the beginning of the school year. It is important that you have your Health Care Card with you when making an application. Successful applicants will then only need to pay \$245.00 per student fee.



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If you received this payment in 2023 you do not need to reapply. You will automatically receive this payment if your Health Care Card is still valid.

Concessional Fee Policy

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage

You will also be required to complete a form as a part of the process to determine eligibility. Should you wish further information re this funding or if you have questions as to whether you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact the school and ask to speak to Joanne Webster.

First Instalment School Fee

If you opted to pay your school fees by three instalments, the first instalment **\$590.00** is due by **Friday 9th February**.

Child Safety

One of the significant areas of child safety improvement has been the ways in which all schools have been directed to accept volunteers in their communities. To this end we encourage all parents and friends wishing to support the school to obtain a Working with Children Check.

The Working with Children Check is free for volunteers and can be obtained by:

1. Filling in the form and verify your identity online at www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au
2. Please ensure you list Bethany Primary School as the school you volunteer at. It is essential that we receive a letter from the Department of Justice validating this.
3. Checking the email that will be sent to you with instructions on how to finalise your application at Australia Post.
4. At Australia Post your photo will be taken at no charge to you.
5. Once the letter arrives at the school, you may volunteer to assist.
6. Volunteer cards are free.

Medication

Where possible it is our preference that medication is administered at home.

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Should this not be possible, it is most important that the school receives clear instructions regarding the administering of medication and that all authorities have a parent signature. To this end we ask that parents only use the school medication request form. Please speak to the Admin Centre Office.



Collecting Children Outside of Normal School Hours

If you need to collect your child before the official dismissal time at 3:00pm, we ask that you contact the Admin Centre office on 9742 9800 to advise the time your child needs to be collected.

At the advised time your child will be waiting in the Admin Centre office. Please make your way to the office to sign out your child.
