## Positive Behaviour for Learning 'Secret Student' - Reward System (Years 3-6)

We are excited to introduce Secret Student, a new Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) initiative for Years 3-6! This strategy helps students make positive choices by encouraging them to do the right thing, not just for a reward but because it feels good to make great choices.

Each morning, one or two students are randomly chosen as the Secret Student. Throughout the day, teachers observe all students, looking for those who consistently show the class behaviour goal. The catch? Students don't know if they are the Secret Student until the end of the day! If they have met the behaviour goal, they earn 10 points for their house.

As an added benefit, students who succeed multiple times can exchange their achievements for special rewards, such as choosing where to sit for a session, reading outside with a friend, or choosing a short quiz game for the class to enjoy. Secret Student fosters a positive classroom environment and encourages students to always do their best - whether they know they're being watched or not!

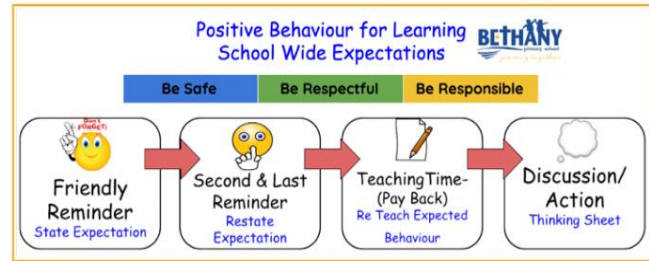

## Happy Families - Helping Your Child Navigate Back-to-School Nerves

## Matters Financial

### Student Levies

All student levies (\$420.00 per student) were expected to be finalised by **Friday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2025**. We would appreciate you attending to this matter if you have not already done so. Payment can be made over the phone by credit card or in person between 8:30am – 4:00pm.

### Health Care Card Holders (CSEF)

Parents who hold a Health Care Card that is current on 29<sup>th</sup> January, 2025 may be eligible for the CSEF. This grant offers \$154.00 per student. The payment is made directly to the school and as such would offset \$154.00 of the student fee.

Families with a Health Care Card are asked to make an application for the Sport / Excursion grant at the beginning of the school year. It is important that you have your Health Care Card with you when making an application. Successful applicants will then only need to pay \$266.00 per student fee.

**If you received this payment in 2024 you do not need to reapply. You will automatically receive this payment if your Health Care Card is still valid.**

### Concessional Fee Policy

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage

You will also be required to complete a form as a part of the process to determine eligibility. Should you wish further information re this funding or if you have questions as to whether you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact the school and ask to speak to Joanne Webster.

### First Instalment School Fee

If you opted to by your school fees by three instalments, the first instalment **\$615.00** is due by this **Friday 14<sup>th</sup> February**.
