

Principal Message Dear Families,

Newsletter No. 9 Wednesday 2nd June 2021

I would like to begin by thanking each and every one of you -students, families and staff for the seamless transition to remote and flexible learning. The school closure last Friday enabled teachers to create, curate and construct learning and teaching for the students with the intention of continued learning throughout this short lockdown.

For students in Years 3-6 the learning was delivered through Google Classroom and the Chromebooks. For P-2, learning was emailed daily and/or printed packs were constructed for students. We are currently in the process of preparing our iPads for students from P-2, with the purpose of issuing these to students and their families as soon as possible, hopefully Monday. Please continue to follow Operoo, over the next couple of days for further information about this.

The State Government has just announced the Covid 19 restrictions for Melbourne Metro will continue for the next 7 days with a possible easing of these on Thursday 10th June 11;59pm.

Vulnerable Students and Authorised or Essential Workers

Vulnerable students and students of authorised or essential workers, need to contact me on the school number 97429800 or email <u>principal@bswerribeenth.catholic.edu.au</u> by **Thursday 3rd June 12 noon, to confirm their continued attendance and dates required.** Please remember to name the student/s and the days they require onsite attendance for.

These students are to continue to enter the school at the small gate or pedestrian gate on Thames Boulevard. We will use the drop off zone on Thames Boulevard for parents dropping students off at school. This will be the only access for families during this period. The gates will open at 8:30am. Students will be dismissed from this gate at 3:00pm. If you require Before or After School Care please register with Quantin Binnah Community Centre, admin@abcc.org.au

Please understand if parents or a parent is working from home, the directive from the State Government is that the student must remain at home to complete remote learning. Essential/authorised workers are only those leaving the family home to work.

Again, we understand that families differ in what can or cannot be achieved with remote learning. If all of this is too much for your family, please do what you can. If you cannot do any of this, please know this is okay too. We acknowledge that many of you work or have infants at home and will find all of this extremely challenging and stressful. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me or the teachers, if you have any questions or concerns.

Remote Learning will continue from Friday 4th June up until Thursday 10th June.

Prep - 2

All learning for tomorrow Friday 4th June, will be posted through Parent Emails. No print packs will be made available for Friday 4th June.

- Zoom meetings for hubs will continue to be organised daily. You will receive a Zoom invitation at 8:30am daily with a time for that day's meeting.
- Help Desk will continue to be available

It is the school's intention to have all Prep to Year 2 students learning online, using the See Saw app and school iPads, beginning on Monday 7th June. We will in the next couple of days continue to inform parents/carers from P-2, of the readiness of the iPads to go home. Please continue to check Operoo for details pertaining to this. If in the event our efforts to get this across the line take longer than expected we will inform you, and arrangements in place over the last week for P-2 remote learning will be re-enacted. Again, information will posted to keep you in the loop. I thank you in advance for your co-operation and patience with this.

Years 3-6

For Years 3-6, the learning will continue as it has this last week-

- Google Classroom will be used to post learning and teaching daily. Learning will be posted at 8:30am each morning.
- Google Meets will occur with students daily in English and Mathematics. English at 9:15am,
 Mathematics at 10:15am. The link for these will be on Google Classroom (not parent email).
- The Google Meets will be 15-20 minutes in duration, to instruct or guide students with regards to the learning task. The students will use the remaining time to complete the task.
- 4 tasks will be set daily.
 - English and Mathematics Compulsory daily
 - o 2 of either Art, Physical Education, Religious Education and Inquiry
- Teachers will provide feedback to students through Google Classroom or email daily.

Again, I would like to thank you for your continued partnership with the school. Together we can make remote learning and flexible learning work for the students, the families and the staff.


Assembly Orange and Sepik

Working with Children Check - Department of Justice Letter

All families who support the school, with volunteer work are required to have a Working with Children Check (WWCC). All parents or adults supporting the school, **must have Bethany listed** as an organisation they volunteer at, as a part of the application process. If you have a WWCC, please ensure you have listed Bethany as a school you volunteer at, on the website. This generates a letter from the Department of Justice to the school permitting you to volunteer on the premises or to attend excursions etc. Unfortunately, without this letter, you will not be able to volunteer at the school. If you unsure as to whether the school has a copy of the letter from the Department of Justice, please feel free to call the Admin Centre to check.
